<p>NON-BURNABLE</p>	<p>1 TIME A WEEK ()</p>		<p>Dispose items in appropriate containers (Must remove from bags)</p> <p>UNBURNABLE</p> <p>METALS & MISCELLANEOUS* *non-burnable items other than glass bottles & cans</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Place dangerous materials such as glass in clear bags when disposing ● Fluorescent bulbs and thermometers are harmful waste. Return to retail shops or take directly to the Environmental Beautification Center ● Machine parts will not be collected no matter how small they may be ● Rinse glass bottles and cans with water ● Earthenware items should be placed in the container for glass bottles ● Aerosol cans are a fire hazard. Empty them of content and pierce a hole prior to disposal. Lighters must also be emptied of remaining fluid. ● Lithium batteries must be disposed of in designated recycling shops / stations in town
